Every dog in Putnam County is required by federal and state law to have a current rabies vaccination and be registered with the Putnam County Animal Control. There is no registration requirement for cats at this time for the county.

Registration Fee and how it works:

The registration fee is \$11.00 per dog per year. You will receive a notice from PCAC when your dog is due for revaccination for rabies, mailed to the address on the last official vaccination certificate on record, approximately 30 days prior.

When your dog receives a 1 year rabies vaccination at your veterinarian, the fee is collected at the time the PC rabies tag is given to you. It is then mailed to us and is entered into our data base.

*If your veterinarian does not dispense Putnam County Tags, you will have to bring (or mail us) a copy of the original Rabies Certificate. We will issue you a tag and collect the registration fee for that dog. If your veterinarian sends PCAC the info, PCAC will issue a tag and send you a bill.

When your dog receives a 3 year rabies vaccination at your veterinarian, the first year's fee is collected at the time the tag is issued and the 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} years' fees are billed on the anniversary date of the vaccination date. These are billed directly from our office.

*If your veterinarian does not dispense Putnam County Tags, you will have to bring (or mail us) a copy of the original Rabies Certificate. We will issue you a tag and collect the first years' registration fee at that time. The 2nd and 3rd years fee will be billed on the anniversary date of the rabies vaccination. If your veterinarian sends PCAC the info, PCAC will issue a tag and send you a bill.

There is not an official "dog catcher" in the county. Stray Dogs are handled either by the individual village police departments deputy's or you can call the County Sheriff's office at (815) 925-7015 and they will dispatch a deputy if available.

Each village in the county has their own separate ordinances pertaining to pet control. Please contact the officials in your village for their requirements.
